Primary research about access to healthcare is outside the purview of the EPC program, which is focused on developing evidence reviews to inform healthcare decision-making. Summary of Nomination: The nominator is interested in primary research to help the low socioeconomic, inner-city, elderly population with their dental needs. The nominator asserts that there is a large influx of homeless, aging individuals and that their poor dental health is contributing to comorbidities such as diabetes and pulmonary issues. The nominator believes that research into this field may increase the opportunities for care in this population.

Background and Clinical Context

Medicare does not cover most dental care; however emergency dental services may be covered in a hospital setting by Medicare Part A.¹ A national initiative called Healthy People 2020 provides 10-year objectives for improving the health of the American people. One of the many goals of the Healthy People 2020 initiative is to, "Improve the health, function, and quality of life of older adults."² This includes increasing the number of dentists with geriatric certification.

2d. Incorporates issues around both clinical benefits and potential clinical harms	This nomination addresses benefits.
2e. Represents high costs due to common use, high unit costs, or high associated costs to consumers, to patients, to health care systems, or to payers	This nomination represents a high cost to healthcare systems.
